We also love walking LuLu, our sweet goldendoodle. She is very affectionate and is great with kids!


We try to go to toddler day events at the zoo, museum, and botanical gardens when we can.




We also go to the beach every year for Memorial Day (and celebrate our birthdays!).

We can't wait to share these traditions - and make new ones - with another child!
















Community
