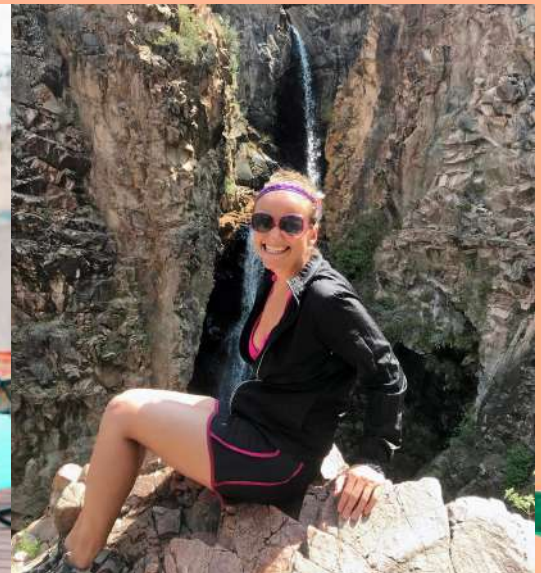








Dear Mom,
